

Jūrmala State City: 100 km²

The largest resort city in the Baltics with a 24 km stretch of beach. Development centre of national importance with the potential to contribute to the international recognition and competitiveness of Latvia. The area of forest land in Jūrmala is 48% of the total area of Jūrmala – 5220 ha. There are three specially protected nature areas of European importance in Jūrmala City: Ķemeri National Park, nature reserve Lielupes grīvas pļavas and nature park Ragakāpa.






Jūrmala is one of the ten state cities of Latvia. Historically, the city united 12 villages: Priedaine, Lielupe, Bulduri, Dzintari, Majori, Dubulti, Jaundubulti, Pumpuri, Melluži, Asari, Vaivari, Jaunķemeri and two small towns – Sloka and Ķemeri. Now Jūrmala is made up of 26 neighbourhoods.




Population dynamics

Cultural, recreational and attractions:

The beach. There are 13 official swimming areas: 11 on the seashore, and two by the River Lielupe

Jomas iela Dzintari Forest Park with an observation tower Kauguri Park Ķemeri Resort Park with a water tower Ķemeri National Park and its nature trails Ragakāpa Nature Park Līvu akvaparks

Jūrmala offers various city routes, nature trails, guided tours, digital tours, cycle routes and specially designed tours for pupils.

One of the greatest prides of Jūrmala is its unique wooden architecture. Being aware of the aesthetic appeal of wood and the suitability of the material for seasonal housing, appreciating its positive properties and impact on both human health and environmental pollution, in the 19th century and the first half of the 20th century, buildings in Riga, Jūrmala were mainly constructed from wood, which is why the predominance of wooden buildings over other types of buildings in the city's architecture is noticeable.

The list of architectural monuments includes 408 buildings, 7 of which are sacred buildings – 3 Lutheran, 2 Catholic and 2 Orthodox churches.

More than 4000 buildings correspond to the historic buildings of the city.
